Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (IASE), Bilaspur is affiliated to Bilaspur University, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh & runs B.Ed. & M.Ed. courses as per University guidance. In two year B.Ed. course the college has 150 students, out of which 75 seats are reserved for departmental fresh candidates. The B.Ed. programme is of two academic years, consists of theory and practical that has (teacher enrichment, engagement field and school internship). School experience and community work session start with orientation for 1st and 2nd year B.Ed. in the month of June and July. For B.Ed 1st year formal classes start in the month of August followed by internship, social work and jeevan vidya in the month of September. In the following month i.e. October and November unit tests, class and assignment work continue simultaneously. For B.Ed 2nd year formal class and assignment are conducted in the month of August followed by unit tests, with two days visit in a week to college in the month of August. Assignments are also submitted. Sports, cultural annual programme actually complement the curricular activities and groom the students. 'Art of Living and working together' in the month of December are conducted for 1st and 2nd year B.Ed. There's an educational tour. Students get exposure to the real world of work for which they are prepared. Technical practical exams are held in the month of March and April as per university schedule. Thus the two year B.Ed. programme aims to produce a reflective teacher with sound pedagogy in the respective subject, to achieve this seminar, workshop, group, discussion, ICT integrated

methods are used. As a teacher one know that continue your education only required, but it's also the best way to stay up to date on a r . This master of Education programme provides an opportunity for pr in the field of education to undertaker advanced course work and re there area of interest. For M.Ed. courses college has in-take of 50 out of which 44 seats are reserved for departmental & 6 for fresh c . Feedback Obtained

Feedback for the student are invited formally at the end of each program in a written form, The student satisfaction surveys includes feedback questionnaire which has three parts, part 1 includes School experiences, and school internship program which has its statements with 4 point scale (very good, satisfactory and unsatisfactory) , part B consists of self identity in teacher, Art and Drama in education, it even has eight statements with 4 points scale (very good, good, satisfactory and unsatisfactory), the part which has 28 questions which includes curriculum areas, internship program experiences and self identity in a descriptive manner. This is a formal way to get feedback at the end of the session. The continuous feedback on each program and activity that are conducted in the college are in the form of the discussion as well as group presentation. The received feedback is then analysed by the IQAC and uploaded to the college website and it is forwarded to the head of the institution with necessary suggestions based on these feedback. as well as verbal presentation are also done by the student. For M.Ed student feedback in the form of active scale of 1 to 5 by a member on different aspect of their teaching skills. Informal feedback in the form of conversation, observation are also taken. Thus it helps the teacher to assess their student demand in area of scholastic and co - scholastic activities.

2.3.2 - Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

In IASE, Student Mentoring is carried out in systematic way. First the faculty is decided by the Department to Mentor student during their internship programme. They visit the respective school on Thursday where trainees are sent, followed by a meeting on every Monday between Student Mentor and trainee at the place regarding their experiences and problem related to infrastructure, curriculum transaction, personal problem which they face during the process. Secondly the student of first year B.Ed. is divided into small group for which two-three mentors are appointed to guide them during the Workshop/Seminar which are based on , understanding and loving their and other's childhood, knowing their self how to write reflective journal. In the same manner 2nd year B.Ed. student are also divided into Workshop/Seminar on development of teacher/ develop as a teacher, know about classroom management, harmonious classroom, know about society and religion and write its reflection. Thirdly for sports programme Annual function (sports) faculty member are divided into 4 Niketan(1: SATYAM 2: SUNDARAM, 4: MADHURAM) to mentor student of 1st 2nd year as a combine unit. The student with the help of mentor's help learn how to organize and execute the activities in their school, which also give them an opportunity to explore their own hidden talent in respective field. In this way under the guidance of their mentor's Workshop/Seminar, student/trainees express their thought independently without any fear and overcome their stage Phobia, which make them better communicator and ultimately a leader to give direction to the next generation. For M.Ed. student, they have a Mentor to guide them for their Dissertation and also during their internship programme. In this way the mentoring system help to develop teacher which increases the quality of this programme conducted in the institution.
