Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (IASE), Bilaspur is affiliated to Atal Bihari Vajpayee Vishvavidyalya, Bilaspur ,Chhattisgarh & runs B.Ed. & M.Ed. courses as per University guidance . For M.Ed. courses college has intake of 50 students out of which 44 seats are reserved for departmental & 6 for fresh candidates . This M.Ed. courses is divided into four semesters & each semesters consists of theory & practical works. In two year B.Ed. course the college has intake of 150 students , Out of which 75 seats are reserved for departmental & 75 for fresh candidates . The B.Ed. programme is of two academic years, which consist of theory and practical that has (teacher enrichment + engagement with field and school internship). School experience and community work. The session start with orientation for 1st and 2nd year B.Ed in the month of June and July. For B.Ed 1st year formal classes start in the month of august followed by internship social work and jeevan vidya in the month of September. In the following month i.e. October and November unit test, theory class and assignment work continue simultaneously. For B.Ed 2nd year workshop and formal class are conducted in the month of followed by unit test. For 4 month , with two days visit in a week to college month of August 2 November, assignment are also submitted. Sports, cultural annual programme which actually complement the curricular activities and groom the students in the '' art of Living and working together'' in the month of December and January for 1st and 2nd year B.Ed. There's a educational tour. Student to give exposure to the real world of work for which are prepared. Technical and practical exam are held in the month

of march and April as per the university schedule. Thus the two years B.Ed. programme aims to prepare reflective teacher with sound pedagogy in the respective subject, in order do achieve this seminar, workshop, group, discussion, ICT integrated teaching methods are used. As a teacher one know that continue your education is not only required, but it's also the best way to stay up to date on a new trends . This master of Education programme provides an opportunity for professional in the field of education to undertaker advanced course work and research in there area of interest. M.Ed. dissertation forms a major activity, which expect the student to understand the steps for research work. 3rd semester include internship programme in another B.Ed. college, to practice the required skill through observation. Educational tour is also and essential part, giving various experience and exposures. M.Ed. courses delivered through ICT integrated teaching- learning, presentation of seminar inside and outside the college, attaining workshop on yoga. B.Ed. and M.Ed. course are run simultaneously which are according to the academic calendar of the institution, in which the faculty are actively involved.
